(ADVANCE)....REGINA, MAY 17 - Five of the graduates at the fourth annual spring Convocation of the University of Saskatchewan Regina Campus today (May 17) received the master of arts degree. They are James William George Brennan of Regina, in history; John Frederick Conway, of Moose Jaw, in psychology; Hans Jacob Kieferle, of Ottawa, in economics; Kenneth Ko-Shien Chao, of Regina, in mathematics; and June Samuels Cosbey, of Regina, in psychology. Mr. Chao received his bachelor of arts degree (BA) from National Chengchi University in Taiwan, and registered at Regina Campus in 1965. He originally registered in English, but has completed his masters degree in mathematics in only two and one half years, to become the first mathematics graduate at Regina Campus. Mrs. Cosbey is the wife of Dr. R. C. Cosbey, professor of english at the Regina Campus.
