RELEASE ON RECEIPT

REGINA, MAY 31, - Dr. A. B. Van Cleave, Chairman of the Natural Sciences Division and Director of the School of Graduate Studies has won the 1968 Chemical Education award of the Chemical Institute of Canada. This is one of the important national awards of the Institute and Dr. Van Cleave will deliver the awards lecture on Wednesday, June 5th, receiving a scroll in recognition of his work.

He was primarily responsible for evaluating the chem study program and having it into the Saskatchewan high schools as a means of improving the quality of instruction in this area.

Born in Medicine Hat, he graduated from the University of Saskatchewan, and received Ph.D. degrees from McGill and Cambridge. He joined the University of Saskatchewan in Saskatoon in the department of Chemistry in 1937, and has served brief periods in industry. In 1962, he was appointed to his present position.
