The Saskatchewan Instructional Development and Research Unit (SIDRU) is a provincial educational research unit located in the Faculty of Education at the University of Regina. Established in 1985, SIDRU's original mandate was to conduct research and promote instructional development associated with the curriculum reform launched by the Department of Education at that time (the *Directions* report and the establishment of CORE Curriculum). In this role, SIDRU served as a focal point in the province for improving the quality of instruction through the development and publication of several important monograph series (some with SPDU), such as, the *Instructional Strategies Series* and the *Diversity Series*.

Over time, the mandate has broadened. In 2002 SIDRU launched the 'New SIDRU' in recognition of the broadened mandate that had evolved, especially by virtue of the Unit's involvement with the Task Force and Public Dialogue on the Role of the School (1999-2000). Currently, the broad array of SIDRU projects includes: program evaluation; program development; Information Communication Technology (ICT) and education; northern and Aboriginal education; and interagency collaboration. Not surprisingly, this range of projects has entailed a wide variety of educational and noneducational partners, both within and beyond the province's boundaries.

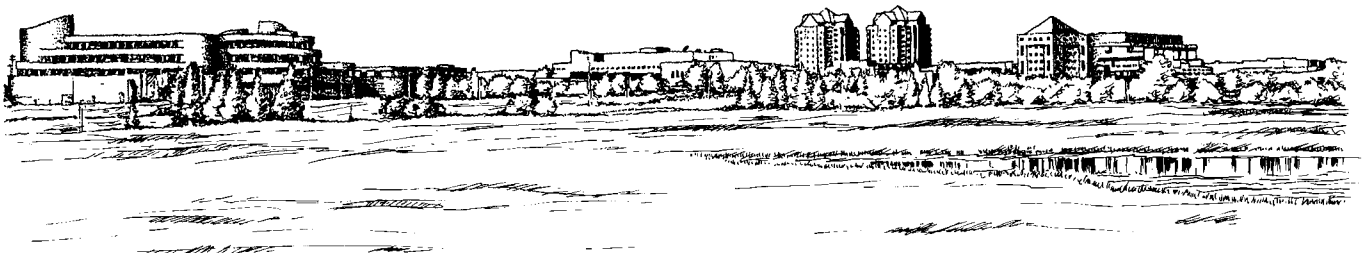

REPORT OF THE DEAN OF EDUCATION

It's a great pleasure to be asked to reflect on the accomplishments of SIDRU for 2005-06. This has been a year of transition within SIDRU. As a result of realignment within the Faculty of Education, SIDRU is now directly linked to the Office of Research and Graduate Programs. We were very fortunate this year in having Warren Wessel—the Associate Dean of Research and Graduate Programs—serve as Acting Director of SIDRU while Michael Tymchak was away on sabbatical research leave. We were also fortunate in having Ann Curry—Assistant Director—and Juanita Duncan—Research Assistant—in the office. They were able to provide support for new and ongoing projects, as well as assume the responsibilities of Michelle Pawliuk who resigned from the University of Regina to spend more time with her family.

This has also been a year of consolidation. SIDRU continues to play a significant leadership role in informing and shaping policy, practice and research related to School^{PLUS}. There has been excellent progress with respect to the upcoming School^{PLUS} II Congress, scheduled for Fall 2006, and the School^{PLUS} Leadership Consortium. Over the past year, SIDRU has created a new consortium with educational partners in the North; launched a new project that examines assessment practices for learning; and

developed a study that explores intern and classroom teachers' understandings of information communication technology integration. SIDRU has also completed projects that look at teacher workload, aboriginal knowledge and perspectives, early childhood education, professional development, and technology enhanced teaching and learning. In addition, SIDRU has allocated research funds to faculty members, conducted surveys of recent graduates and provided support to the academic journal, *Policy and Practice in Education*. In all these endeavours, SIDRU is contributing to the research capacity of the Faculty of Education and developing creative new ways of thinking about and responding to emerging educational, socio-cultural, and economic challenges that we are facing in our classrooms, our schools, and our communities.

I would like to thank Warren Wessel for his work this year as Acting Director. Warren has provided strong stewardship for SIDRU during this period of transition and consolidation. Through his direction and management, a number of projects have been brought to completion and new opportunities for collaboration and networking have been identified.

Many thanks also to Ann Curry and Juanita Duncan for the sense of commitment, creativity and good humour that they bring to all aspects of their work at SIDRU. Their experience, expertise and outstanding organizational skills are a key aspect of SIDRU's reputation for high-quality work.

I also want to thank the Provincial Advisory Board for their ongoing work to support SIDRU. The annual meetings provide excellent forums for discussion and feedback about new directions and opportunities. The Advisory Board has provided strategic advice that has helped SIDRU to extend and redefine its interdisciplinary and collaborative partnering throughout the province and beyond.

This is my last greeting as Dean of the Faculty of Education. It has been my great privilege to work with SIDRU directors, staff and members of the Advisory Board over the past six years. I greatly appreciate the creative work that everyone has done to revise and renew SIDRU. The Faculty of Education has a new tagline: *Inspiring and Transforming Education*. I see SIDRU's projects as an essential part of this exciting work.

REPORT OF THE A/DIRECTOR

During 2005-06, the Faculty of Education underwent some structural reorganization. A new position of Associate Dean of Research and Graduate Programs was created to better reflect the value placed on research and graduate programs in the Faculty and within the University of Regina. As a result of the reorganization, SIDRU is now aligned under the Associate Dean of Research and Graduate Programs in the Faculty of Education. As well this past year, Michael Tymchak, Director of SIDRU, has been on a year's administrative leave and during this time I have been Acting Director.

As Acting Director of SIDRU, my learning curve has been ridiculously steep. Over the years, SIDRU has operated quietly and effectively in the Faculty of Education without faculty members understanding the range of research activities carried out under its auspices. My own understanding of the research projects facilitated by SIDRU has increased enormously, and I have gained considerable appreciation for the research that has been carried out over the years and, in particular, this past year. SIDRU has provided opportunities for faculty members to undertake research projects suited to their knowledge and abilities. The faculty who carried out these projects brought a high level of expertise to the research and demonstrated rigorous professional standards. Because of the reorganization and trimming back of activities, no funding was available to faculty during this academic year.

A partner, the Keewatin Career Development Corporation (KCDC) again contracted SIDRU for Phase II of their technology project – *First Nations Virtual Resource Centre Feasibility Study*. The work progressed well and the final report was submitted. The *Teacher Workload Study* - a joint project of the Regina Public School Teachers' Association and the Regina Public School Board - was completed in late fall of 2005. The *SIASST Certificate for Instructors* (Phase IV) is an ongoing, collaborative project between the Faculty of Education and SIASST. This summer the program will have introductory sessions in both Regina and Saskatoon. In the following year, the advanced version of the program will be available online for SIASST instructors. It has been a collaborative, successful effort. The *Aboriginal Knowledge and Perspectives* (Phase II) project was completed, with submission of the final report in March. This project was funded by Saskatchewan Learning (AERN), in collaboration with the Office of the Treaty Commissioner.

School^{PLUS} Congress II will occur in the fall of 2006. SIDRU, as a Founding Member of the Congress, will again take a central role in the organization and planning. Dr. Barbara Keirnes Young is, again, Congress Director and is in the midst of planning the program and keynote speakers. *School^{PLUS} Congress II* will be held November 1 to 3 in Regina, and we are again looking forward to a successful, meaningful event.

In the 2005-06 academic year, SIDRU hosted over 20 *SIDRU Seminars* in both the fall and winter semesters. Presenters included graduate students who had recently completed their theses, professionals from the educational community, and members of the Faculty of Education. Topics ranged from aspects of technology and other current issues to issues of social justice and Aboriginal education. About 270 people attended, indicating the seminars had a good audience and provided a podium for exploration of issues in education.

I would be remiss if I did not acknowledge and thank Juanita Duncan and Dr. Ann Curry for the work they have done for SIDRU during the past year. As usual, Juanita used her superb organizational skills to keep the office running and deal with the day-to-day operations. Ann Curry acted as Assistant Director but did most of the tasks normally carried out by the Director. She managed the research projects and prodded the researchers in such a manner so as to ensure the research reports were produced on schedule and ready for distribution on time. Finally I want to welcome Michael Tymchak back as Director of SIDRU.

FINANCE AND MANAGEMENT

General operating expenses and staff salaries were supported by SIDRU revenues and the Faculty of Education.

The University of Regina provided a portion of the Director's salary, office space, and other university services, including the Business Office, Computing Services, library, audiovisual, and administrative support.

ORGANIZATION AND STRUCTURE

SIDRU operates on the basis of a constitution which provides a mission statement and an organizational structure. The organization is governed by the Charter of the University of Regina. The Director, appointed annually by the President upon recommendation of the Dean of Education, reports to the Dean of Education; to the Dean, Faculty of Graduate Studies and Research; and to the Provincial Advisory Board which consists of representatives from each of the provincial educational agencies.

RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT PROJECTS

SIDRU's mandate intends that this unit serve an important role - the improvement of instruction in the provincial educational system. The original mandate suggests that instructional improvement activities of the unit be directed toward research related to teaching and its impact on learning. Functions described within the SIDRU constitution intend that the unit fulfill this mandate through

the following activities: conducting research and development activities relevant to instruction within the Saskatchewan context; consulting with school systems in areas such as project design and evaluation; disseminating research findings, methodological approaches, and critical analyses of research through publications and other means; facilitating cooperative problem solving and identifying needs and resources; and providing research and development training opportunities for graduate students and others in the field of education.

GENERAL RESEARCH AND DEVELOPMENT ACTIVITIES

The SIDRU constitution lists several functions that are intended as a mandate for instructional research and development within Saskatchewan's educational community.

These functions include consulting and assisting in project design and evaluation; disseminating research findings through various means; facilitating cooperative research and development activity among individuals, groups, and organizations; providing opportunities for graduate student involvement; and identifying and securing funding for research and development.

Although project descriptions demonstrate unit involvement in each of these mandated functions during the past year, SIDRU has assumed a leadership role in several more broadly circumscribed areas of its mandate as follows:

- as a provincial consulting agency for educational research design and methodology.

During 2005 to 2006, SIDRU continued to provide consulting services to faculty members, graduate students, school divisions, and government departments.

SIDRU staff have also responded to requests from contract researchers for assistance with budget development, specification of research parameters, and grant application analysis. We continue to develop high-quality editing and word processing capabilities.

The SIDRU Seminar Series provided weekly seminars focusing on research and development issues at all educational levels during both academic semesters as noted below. Graduate students, faculty, many members of Saskatchewan's educational community, and a number of guest speakers provided an excellent array of topics for participants.
