Academic Misconduct & Plagiarism

In order to remind students about the seriousness of academic misconduct and the severity of potential penalties, please remember to include a statement about academic misconduct in your course outlines for both undergraduate and graduate courses.

The Faculty of Business Administration has included in the Undergraduate Calendar a statement in section 11.5.4 as follows:

Students enrolled in Business courses at the University of Regina are expected to adhere rigorously to principles of intellectual integrity. Plagiarism is a form of intellectual dishonesty in which another person's work is presented as one's own. Plagiarism or cheating on examinations/assignments is a serious offence that may result in a zero grade on an assignment, a failing grade in a course, or expulsion from the University. For more information on this matter, please consult Section 5.13 of the Undergraduate Calendar.

The previous statement should appear prominently on your BUS course outline, and be discussed at the beginning of each academic term. GBUS and EMBA courses should include similar wording, based on the Graduate Calendar pp. 37-42. If you haven't yet discussed this in your course, we encourage you to do so.
