SPSS

Print Optimization

The University is entering Phase 2 of Print Optimization, and as such, you are encouraged to reduce printing whenever possible. Many are already posting course material on UR Courses which reduces the amount of material printed. We are also being encouraged to use the multifunction network printers/copiers rather than desktop printers. These devices use less electricity, contributing to sustainability, a key component of the University's Strategic Plan. Cards are available for use with the multifunction devices which reduce the number of steps required. Cards are available **Devon Anderson** or **Edwin Narzoles**.

Faculty and staff are encouraged to send large print jobs directly to Print Services by email. An email template is saved in the 'For Faculty & Staff' section on the Business Admin website. Please note on your email if the document is either a mid-term or a final exam. Print Services will wrap exams in brown paper to return to us.

Print jobs are delivered each morning. You should allow 48 hours turn-around for print jobs - an additional 24 hours is required to complete the process if you prefer to send hard copies.

United Way Campaign

The Annual University of Regina's United Way employee campaign begins October 1. The campaign theme this year is "**All that kids can be**". A 2009-11 baseline study showed that 1 in 3 children in Regina, from all socio-economic backgrounds, are 'not fully ready for school' on their first day of school.

Up to grade three, children learn to read - after grade three, they read to learn. For a variety of reasons, many children are not reaching pivotal reading and literacy levels on time, leaving their future academic success in doubt; as a result, we're losing many youth as they transition through high school.

Many of the United Way Regina funded partners work directly with families and youth to help them gain and maintain the skills and strengths needed to be ready for school. Among these agencies are the Regina Early Learning Centre, REACH, Regina Open Door Society, Cornwall Alternative School, ECIP, and many others.
