(ADVANCE)...REGINA, MAY 2 - Some 300 students were honored today (Saturday, May 2) at the annual Closing Exercises of the University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus, in Darke Hall, and more than 40 awards were presented to deserving students. It was the last Closing Exercises to be held at Regina Campus, since the ceremony will be replaced in future by an annual Convocation.

The Principal W.A. Riddell Gold Medal for the student with the highest academic record was awarded to Mary Jane Van Der Gucht, Regina. Miss Van Der Gucht, who lives at 2217 Retallack St., is in second year arts and science at Regina Campus and is taking a course which concentrates on languages. Her father is Jan Van Der Gucht, head of the Vocal Department, Regina Conservatory of Music. She also won a special prize for summer studies in French and a University of Saskatchewan Undergraduate Scholarship for General Proficiency.

The J.L. Dick Prize in Accounting was awarded to Terrence Grant Graf, of Langenburg. Lorne George Uher and Lawrence Richard Hahn, both of Regina won Rex L. Brown Prizes in chemistry. Both also were awarded University of Saskatchewan Undergraduate Scholarships for General Proficiency. Reeves Prizes in Art were won by Lorna Jean Farrell and Catherine Joanne Christie, both of Regina. Wilma Anne Bell, Regina, won the Norman Ratner Scholarship. The B'nai B'rith M.D. Brownstein Scholarship was awarded to Audrey Marilyn Cameron, Regina, but it went by reversion to Carla Winnifred Stein, Regina. Both won University of Saskatchewan Undergraduate Scholarships for General Proficiency. However, Miss Cameron's went by reversion to Carol Joan Vance, Regina.

The Regina Section, National Council of Jewish Women of Canada Scholarship was awarded to Lynda Marie Roney, Regina. She also won a University of Saskatchewan Undergraduate Scholarship for General Proficiency.

Joanne Elizabeth Kidd, Regina, won a special prize for summer studies in French. She also won a University of Saskatchewan Undergraduate Scholarship for General Proficiency.
