## RELEASE ON RECEIPT

REGINA, SEPT. 18 - The human problems of people living in Saskatchewan and elsewhere will be the subject of a series of public meetings in Regina this year, according to the Division of Social Sciences, University of Saskatchewan, Regina Campus. "Plain Talk" is the name given to these meetings, which will present distinguished visiting speakers from various parts of the world.

Professor D.W. Smythe, Chairman of the Division, said today that the series is designed for the general public as well as for students at the University, and for students and teachers of collegiate institutes.

"Unlike most lecture series, these meetings will include audience questions and discussion with the speakers. They also will deal with a single broad subject. In 1964-65 the subject will be "Toward the Future Society" Professor Smythe said. Speakers will talk on topics of their own choice related to this subject. It is hoped to hold the series annually, and in later years other themes will be selected.

"We hope to present a diversity of viewpoints from experts from various parts of Canada and other countries. We also hope to attract a regular public audience which will be interested in and participate in all meetings in the series. There will be no admission charge this year", Professor Smythe said.

He added that it is planned to have each of the visiting speakers remain in Regina for at least two days. Besides speaking to the public meetings, they will also be expected to meet informally with people in the community, including University faculty and student groups. An announcement of the names of the visiting speakers and their topics will be made in the near future.
