Web Mark Entry replacement

DOME, a new web mark entry system, will launch on November 1st. This new system maintains the same functionality as Web Mark Entry but updates the underlying 15-year-old architecture and adds some new features such as the ability to view both the approval routing and current approval stage for each course, download and upload class roster functionality, screen view customization, and new report functionality. Effective November 1st, the current link to Web Mark Entry will re-direct users to the new DOME product. Any historical grading information currently housed in Web Mark Entry will be viewable from within DOME. To assist with the transition, a wide variety of assistance will be provided. Manuals have been written, training sessions in the TLC will be provided, numerous TLC drop-in times will be available during the grading period and Denise Seidler, the Registrar's Office web mark entry specialist, who has been involved in the development of this product will be available to provide assistance as needed.

Faculty Convocation Survey

Here are some additional highlights from the June 2015 survey of our graduating Hill and Levene students.

Hill Students:

- 60% of respondents are from Regina (ie: living in Regina prior to starting their program), 28% are from Saskatchewan
- 80% of respondents were employed (or had secured upcoming employment) as of convocation day. Of these jobs:
 - 82% were in Regina, 12% were in Saskatchewan
 - 33% were in a national/international firm, 29% in the public sector and 23% in a local independent firm
 - 67% were permanent full-time, 26% were temporary full-time
 - 44% of respondents had a salary in the \$40,000-49,999 range
 - The average salary of respondents was \$44,470

Levene Students:

- 57% of respondents are from Regina (ie: living in Regina prior to starting their program), 14% are from Saskatchewan
- 50% of respondents had accepted a new role/position since starting their Levene program with 80% of those considering it a promotion
- The average salary of respondents at the start of their program was \$60,000 and this had increased to \$67,500 by the end
 - Of those respondents who had experienced a salary increase 80% attributed the increase to being “somewhat or very much” a result of the complete of their Levene program

EMBA Students:

- 75% of respondents are from Regina (ie: living in Regina prior to starting their program), 13% are from Saskatchewan
- 69% of respondents had accepted a new role/position since starting their EMBA with 89% of those considering it a promotion
- The average salary of respondents at the start of their program was \$92,500 and this had increased to \$107,500 by the end
 - Of those respondents who had experienced a salary increase 77% attributed the increase to being “somewhat or very much” a result of the complete of their EMBA program
