SSHRC Application Funding - \$500

We are encouraging all SSHRC-eligible faculty members to apply for a SSHRC grant this year if they do not currently hold SSHRC funding.

The Faculty of Business Administration will provide **\$500** in research grant funding to anyone who is applying for tri-council funding this year as Principal Investigator (or as Co-Investigator if the funding proposal is for more than \$250,000). Please let **David Senkow** know if you are planning a major SSHRC, CIHR, or NSERC application, and he will arrange to have the funds transferred to a research account for you.

New faculty members who received start-up research funding from the Faculty of Business Administration are expected to apply for SSHRC funding in their second or third year as a faculty member.

As we explained in the faculty SSHRC meeting last month, the size of the SSHRC funding envelope for Business and Management is dependent upon the number of applications and amount of funding requested in total, so every application helps to increase the total amount of grant funding available to business researchers.

Keep in mind that it is not unusual to apply 3-4 times before finally receiving major grant funding – so please keep on trying!

Proposal for a Major in Entrepreneurship

The Entrepreneurship area group and the Undergraduate Program Committee will both spend some time this summer reviewing and refining a proposal for a Major in Entrepreneurship. Associate Dean **David Senkow** will oversee this process.
