Sabbatical Applications Due – Oct. 1

Anyone eligible for a sabbatical during the 2010/11 academic year must submit an application to the Dean no later than **October 1, 2009**. The URFA Collective Agreement outlines the terms and conditions for sabbaticals in Article 16.7. Sabbatical applications will be reviewed by the Dean's Advisory Committee.

To be eligible for a first sabbatical, the academic staff member must have at least six years of continuous employment at the University of Regina, and hold an appointment with tenure. A sabbatical is for a period of twelve months (at 80% salary) or six months (at 100% salary), usually commencing either July 1 or January 1.

As part of the sabbatical application, a detailed statement of plans for the sabbatical period is required, including the anticipated benefits to the academic staff member and the institution. The sabbatical application form is available on the password-protected portion of our Faculty website. Following are details we recommend you include in your sabbatical plan:

- Whether you are requesting 6 months or 12 months, and what the start date will be (July 1 or January 1)
- What research or scholarly activities you intend to carry out, and what outputs you anticipate (e.g., journal articles or books)
- What resources or research grants you will have available (or will be applying for) in order to carry out this work
- Whether you plan to stay in Regina or go elsewhere (a letter of invitation as a visiting scholar is a useful supporting document)
- Whether you plan to teach a course(s) during sabbatical (and where)

Faculty members are normally requested to vacate their office for a 12-month sabbatical, but may retain their office for a 6-month sabbatical. After the sabbatical, the academic staff member must prepare a report and presentation of their activities during the sabbatical.
