President's Research Seed Grant & SSHRC Explore Grant

Applications are now being accepted for the U of R President's Research Seed Grant and SSHRC Explore Grant. This is an annual internal competition for funding to support research and scholarly work at the U of R. Priority is given to projects that will be developed into research programs eligible for external support. Deadline to apply is May 15. The awards are made available from:

- Allocation from operating funds made annually by the President;
- SSHRC Institutional Grant
- Allocation from the NSERC GRF when sufficient funds are available

Eligibility:

- Academic faculty members (see guidelines for further details)
- Proposals may fall within any of the Tri-Council program areas
- Awards are limited to 2 every 5 years
- Cannot currently be holding internal funding awarded by the Vice-President (Research)
