REGINA, FEB. 16 - "Civil Liberties in Canada's Second Century" will be the topic of the fifth meeting in the Plain Talk series for 1967-68 on Monday, Feb. 19, at 3 p.m. in the auditorium of Sheldon-Williams Collegiate, Regina.

Professor F.R. Scott will present the talk after which there will be questions, comment and discussion, according to Dallas W. Smythe, chairman, Division of Social Sciences, Regina Campus, which produces the Plain Talk series. Admission is free.

The series topic for Plain Talk in 1967-68 is "Canadian Life in the Technological Age".

Most recently, Dr. Scott has been a member of the Royal Commission on Biculturalism and Bilingualism. Born in Quebec in 1899, he was educated at Bishop's College in Quebec, Magdalen College, Oxford, where he was a Rhodes scholar, and McGill. His long career in teaching was capped with the deanship of the McGill University Faculty of Law from 1961-64. The author of a number of books and holder of numerous honorary degrees, Dr. Scott also has a distinguished record of public service.
