The Canadian Plains Research Center at the University of Regina is home to Saskatchewan's largest, non-fiction, and only university press. Established in 1973, the Press has published over 200 titles. Although the Press specializes in publishing scholarly manuscripts which examine various aspects of life in the prairie region of Canada, it also publishes non-fiction trade titles concerning this region.

Our newest release is *Our Towns: Saskatchewan Communities from Abbey to Zenon Park*. In this lavishly illustrated book, author David McLennan guides us on an alphabetical tour of 725 Saskatchewan communities. *Our Towns* is the result of many years of travel throughout the province. Meticulously researched, and illustrated with more than 1,000 stunning, previously unpublished photographs (both historical and contemporary), *Our Towns* is a truly unique reflection of the province's history and people.
