REGINA, MARCH 5 - The sixth regular meeting of "Plain Talk" will be held on Tuesday, March 9 at 8 p.m. in the auditorium of Sheldon-Williams Collegiate, Regina. Professor H.H. Wilson will talk on "The American Way: Model or Warning?" The public's attention is called to the fact that this meeting of "Plain Talk" will be held on Tuesday night and not, as originally announced, on Monday night.

Professor Wilson is now a Visiting Professor of Political Science at the University of Saskatchewan Regina Campus. He is on leave from Princeton University, New Jersey, where he is a Professor in the Department of Politics. Supporting his provocative topic for "Plain Talk" is a background rich in the critical analysis of American and British behavior and institutions. Professor Wilson's latest book, "Pressure Group: The Campaign for Commercial Television in England" was debated in the House of Lords in 1962. His study of Congressional operation in Washington led to his book "Congress: Corruption and Compromise," published in 1950. Together with Harvey Glickman, he wrote "The Problem of Internal Security in Great Britain", published in 1954. And with R.C. Snyder, he wrote "Roots of Political Behavior", published in 1949. In addition, he has written a number of journal and magazine articles on a variety of topics of current interest.

Born in Springfield, Massachusetts, Professor Wilson is a member of the National Advisory Committee of Consumers Union, and formerly was a member of the Academic Freedom Committee of the American Civil Liberties Union. He was a Lieutenant in the United States Navy during World War II. His Ph.D. was earned at the University of Wisconsin, his Masters degree at Clark University, and his Bachelor's degree at Springfield College.
