Official Release of the Aboriginal Population Profile (Phase 2)

The 2001 Aboriginal Population Profile (Phase 2) is now available via the Census Web site

The data for the profiles was released in two phases.

Phase 2 completes the data for the profile with the

exception of two stublines and their data points. They will be added in the near future:

- Worked full year, full time (counts)
- Average earnings (worked full year, full time (\$))

Additional data points were added to the Phase 1 portion that further expanded the Aboriginal Identity Population into specific Aboriginal groupings.

Phase 1 –

- Population Characteristics – Aboriginal Identity Population, Registered Indian Status, Age Characteristics, Common-law Status, Legal Marital Status, Language Characteristics, Mobility

Phase 2 –

- Education – School Attendance, Highest Level of Schooling
- Earnings and Work – Earnings, Place of Work, Mode of Transportation, Labour Force Indicators, Industry, Occupation
- Income
- Families and Dwellings – Census Family Status, Selected Occupied Private Dwelling Characteristics and Household Characteristics

Survey of Household Spending 2000

This survey was carried out in private households in the provinces only; data for the northern territories were not collected in 2000. It is planned to conduct the SHS in the territories every second year, starting in 2001. Data will continue to be collected annually for the provinces.

Variables added to the survey for 2000 include: Housing adequacy indicator; Housing affordability indicator; Housing suitability indicator; Required number of bedrooms; and Monthly serviced rental payments.

Labour Force Survey

The Labour Force Survey data is now received on a monthly basis through the DLI. January 2002 is the first month for which monthly data is available.

Charitable Donors; RRSP Contributions and Other Taxfiler Data

Taxfiler Data from the Small Area and Administrative Data Division (SAAD) are available for the years 1995 through 1999, on the Data Library services web page. The Excel tables provide data under the umbrella headings: Economic Dependency Profiles; Labour Force Income Profiles, Families; Neighbourhood Income and Demographics; Seniors; Charitable Donors; and Financial Databanks of SAAD.

Canadian Election Surveys

The *2000 Canadian Election Survey* is now available. Included are the SPSS portable file (zipped), technical documentation and questionnaires in PDF format.

National Longitudinal Survey of Children and Youth: Cycle 4

National Longitudinal Survey of Children and Youth: Challenges of Late Adolescence 2000/01 (NLSCY) is a comprehensive survey that follows the development of children in Canada. In Cycle 4, 95% of 16 and 17 year olds say they are healthy and optimistic about their future.

Documentation is available at Data Services. Synthetic files have been released. Please note: a PUMF will not be produced; access to Cycle 4 data will be through the Research Data Centres only.

Health Services Access Survey

Tables from the first cycle were loaded into CANSIM and the publication [Access to Health Care Services in Canada 2001](#):

The questions from Cycle 1 have now been added to the Canadian Community Health Survey 2.1. Data will be forthcoming in spring 2004 and a PUMF will be created.

Social Policy Simulation Database and Model (SPSD/M), Version 9.2

This new update is capable of modeling the tax/transfer system rules for all years from 1988 through 2005.

It includes the following changes:

- Recent economic growth projections from Finance Canada are incorporated into the parameter files.
- The parameter files and tax/transfer algorithms have been updated through the 2002 tax forms and all federal and provincial 2003 budgets.



CANSIM I vs. CANSIM II

Question: Why is a link maintained to CANSIM I on the Data Library Services page when it is no longer updated?

Answer: The link to CANSIM I is maintained because

- It has not lost its historical research value. It includes the matrix numbers and series labels that were part of Statistics Canada print publications for three decades.
- It provides an index of sorts to the Statistics Canada print collection.
- It provides access to tables / series that have not been included in CANSIM II.
